Dear Northview families:

Thank you for your continued support as we navigate our quickly changing reality. This communication serves to provide several updates regarding Northview operations during the mandated school closure:

Stay at Home – Stay Safe Order

This afternoon, Governor Whitmer issued a ‘Stay Home, Stay Safe’ order for all Michigan residents unless they are part of the critical infrastructure workforce, engaged in an outdoor activity, or performing tasks necessary to the health and safety of themselves or their family, like going to the hospital or grocery store. This order begins on March 24, 2020, at 12:01 am, and extends through April 13, 2020, at 11:59 pm. Schools will remain closed at least through this date.

Meal Distribution

Our meal distribution is considered a “critical infrastructure” service and will continue as previously published. Families may come to Northview High School to pick up a meal. This is available for ANY student 18 years of age or younger. You do not need to qualify for the Free/Reduced Lunch Program and you do not need to be a Northview student. You can also send someone else to the high school to pick up your meals for you if you are unable to pick them up yourself. If you are not able to attend the pick-up day/time and do not have someone to pick them up for you, please call: 616-363-6861.
