**2020-2021 Calendar & School Year**

As this challenging spring semester draws to a close, we turn our attention to the fall. The most pressing question in front of us is when - and how - will Northview Public Schools resume in-person instruction and on-site programming. Unfortunately, there are still too many unknowns to release a detailed plan for the fall, however we are happy to share that, while we do not know what the first day of school will look like, we do have a settled start date for students: *Tuesday, August 25, 2020*.
