## Chapter 7 Vocabulary

Essential Question: How do American consumption patterns affect people and the planet?

- 1. <u>consumption:</u> the using up of goods and services; also the purchase and use of goods and services by consumers
- 2. <u>developed countries:</u> a wealthy country with an advanced economy. Developed countries have many industries and provide a comfortable way of live for most of their people
- 3. <u>developing countries:</u> a poorer country with a less advanced economy. In general, developing countries are trying to increase their industries and improve life for their people
- 4. <u>gross domestic product (GDP):</u> the total value of goods and services produced in a country in a year
- 5. <u>per capita</u>: by or for each person. A per capita figure is calculated by dividing the total amount of something by the number of people in a place.
- 6. <u>calories:</u> a measure of the amount of energy in food
- 7. <u>fossil fuel:</u> any fuel, such as petroleum, coal, and natural gas, that is made from the remains of prehistoric plants and animals
- 8. <u>technology:</u> the creation and use of tools to meet practical needs; also refers to the tools themselves
- 9. <u>digital divide</u>: the difference in opportunities available to people who have access to computers and the Internet and those who do not
- 10. <u>work ethic:</u> a belief in the moral value, or goodness, of hard work
- 11. <u>recycling</u>: the process of collecting used materials that would otherwise be thrown away and turning them into raw materials for new uses
