Reminder: Northview High School/NNCC Testing Week (April 12-16)

Families of students in grades 9-12, please note important schedule changes for the week after spring break. Full details are in the [Spring 2021 Testing Calendar](#). We wish all our students success as they head into this important academic week.

Note on Center for Disease Control (CDC), Michigan Department of Health and Humans Services (MDHHS) and Kent County Health Department (KCHD) Guidelines

COVID-19 safety guidelines continue to evolve. Northview works diligently with the KCHD to align and communicate the applicable guidelines. For example, on Friday, March 19, the CDC changed their recommendation for physical distancing in schools to a minimum of three feet. However, both the Kent County Health Department and the CDC continue to view a close contact in grades 9-12 as someone who has been within six feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24 hour period. Those students who are identified as a close contact are required to quarantine for 10 days, or for seven days with a negative test result on day seven.
