Dear Northview families,

Over the past week, the number of positive COVID cases in Michigan has increased. Students, particularly those in grades 9-12, have contributed to this increase. The vast majority of students who do not have an underlying health condition recover quickly after contracting the virus. However, the continuing concern is the spread of the virus from those who are minimally impacted to those who are at high risk. I continue to be incredibly grateful for the Northview community, where even when there is disagreement, there is respect, kindness and consideration of others.

At this point, the impact of the positive case increase has been relatively minimal in Northview Public Schools. However, this could quickly change; I am encouraging every family to create contingency plans in case it becomes necessary for us to move to virtual or return to the cohort model again this school year. If changes in our schedule do become necessary, they will likely begin in grades 9-12, where the increase in positive COVID cases is most prevalent. *Please note: Grades 9-12 WILL return to the red/white cohort schedule the week of April 12-16.
