



# COVID PROTOCOLS

KCHD Health Order: January 11, 2022

IS THE STUDENT POSITIVE FOR COVID-19?

All persons, regardless of vaccination status, who test positive for COVID-19 are required to isolate at home.

Implementation of the requirements in the KCHD public health order (1/11/22) obligates **Northview students and staff to isolate for 10 days after the onset of symptoms or date of positive test result (whichever is first).**

This is true for all Kent County districts, like Northview, that do not have a universal face mask policy.

IS THE STUDENT LIVING IN THE SAME HOUSEHOLD AS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE?  
(ie, a household close contact)

IS THE STUDENT VACCINATED?

No quarantine necessary as long as student wears a well-fitting mask to school throughout the duration of the household case's isolation period plus an additional 10 days,

Families should monitor student for symptoms during this time period.

Required to quarantine. Student must stay home during the household case's full isolation period of at least 5 days **and** for a minimum of 5 days following the end of the household case's isolation period. Household contacts may then return to school wearing a well-fitting mask at all times on days 6 through 10, monitoring daily for symptoms.

If student is unable/unwilling to wear a face mask from days 6 through 10, they must quarantine at home for the entire 10 days from the date of last exposure to the household positive case.

IS THE STUDENT A CLOSE CONTACT?

Unvaccinated students are recommended to quarantine for 5 days from date of last known exposure. (CDC)
