

Literacy is a cornerstone of every student’s educational foundation. Northview will provide a curriculum that will be structured to provide every student with the knowledge, skills and tools to be literate in reading and math.

Reading literacy defined: Literacy is the ability to identify, understand, interpret, create, communicate and compute, using printed and written materials associated with varying contexts (UNESCO 2018).

Mathematics literacy defined: Mathematical literacy is an individual’s capacity to identify and understand the role that mathematics plays in the world, to make well-founded judgments, and to engage in mathematics in ways that meet the needs of that individual’s current and future life as a constructive, concerned and reflective citizen (OECD 1999).

- 4.1.1 The Northview student demonstrates growth in the mastery of Northview’s Priority Standards in Reading as measured by the STAR Benchmark Assessment. To achieve this standard, 80% of assessed students will show growth between their fall and spring assessment.
