Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-2023 educational progress for Highlands Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Principal Jamey Vermaat for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the MISchoolData.org website or you may review a copy in the main office at your child's school.

For the 2023-2024 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. *I am pleased to share that Highlands Middle School was not assigned any of the foregoing labels.*

Based on statewide assessment data, Highlands Middle School compares very favorably to schools across the state of Michigan. As part of our continued school improvement process, we focus on increasing student achievement in all core academic areas.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL:

Northview Public Schools operates one comprehensive 5/6 middle school. All students who reside within the Northview attendance area attend Highlands Middle School following the 4th grade.

As part of state law, the district also participates in the Schools of Choice (SOC) program for non-resident families.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN:

Highlands Middle School continues to use the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP) to re-evaluate current goals, establish new goals, and collaboratively work together to improve student performance. Highlands Middle School works collaboratively with the entirety of the district to ensure *all* students are achieving their best, while utilizing specific programming at the building level to ensure students are scaffolded in their learning.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL:

Northview Public Schools offers DK-4; 5-6; 7-8; and 9-12 buildings. All of the schools within our district operate under the same academic rigor and goals. We strive for consistency in excellence in each school and work closely together to achieve academic success as defined by state and local thresholds.

The Northview Public School's core curriculum is aligned with academic standards adopted by the Michigan Department of Education.
